### **The English Faculty**

### **English Language and Literature**

We teach English at Belle Vue to share a love of language and literature. We want to encourage a love of life-long reading; our promotion of AR and traditional silent reading help students to discover determination and resilience. Our text choices often reflect an active desire to enlighten students about the ways women's issues have always been central to the development of literature and culture. We hope to develop students' critical thinking skills and confidence as well as presenting them with a range of diverse topics and issues. All of this contributes to a broadening of students' experiences. English lessons are always ambitious, viewing the subject as part of a bigger cultural picture. We want our students to embrace different life experiences and historical periods, read with fluency and confidence, develop empathy, to ask questions and to be active - not passive - readers. Our students are encouraged to express themselves with confidence, whether this be orally or through different written forms. We help them to write without feeling self-conscious.

The English curriculum reflects our desire to make connections between literature and contexts, creating vibrant lessons in which students can make effective links between texts and the situations in which they were created. We evaluate our curriculum each year to make sure it stays relevant to students' needs and our vision. Students will always be given opportunities to develop skills rather than simply be prepared for exams: our English faculty is passionate about empowering students through engaging them and equipping them with knowledge and techniques. Our on-going KS3 oracy project will give students opportunities to speak formally in different contexts and will be invaluable in making sure they have the chance to become confident and effective communicators.

Students can use knowledge gained in English lessons in many aspects of their lives; our aim is to ensure they realise this and feel excited about the autonomy this brings with it.

### Drama

We teach Drama at Belle Vue to share a love of theatre and performance. We want to inspire students with a desire to explore a wealth of ideas and situations through acting, movement and stagecraft. Drama is an essential part of the curriculum at Belle Vue because it offers students a space in which to be creative and experimental. It encourages a more open and empathetic mind-set which ensures students can develop a deeper understanding of the wider world. Drama lessons will always engage students with questions about how they can present their ideas to an audience, focusing on dramatic techniques and devices as well as more physical aspects such as movement and voice. The Drama curriculum reflects our desire to make connections between literature and contexts. We evaluate our curriculum each year to make sure it stays relevant to students' needs and our vision. Students will always be given opportunities to develop skills and creative approaches rather than simply be prepared for assessments and exams: our Drama faculty is passionate about empowering students through engaging them and equipping them with knowledge and techniques.

## **The Maths Faculty**

We believe with a passion that Maths plays a transformational role in the development of young adults. Our team of enthusiastic maths specialists successfully shape the lives of our learners for the challenges of the real world. We encompass a variety of topics in our teaching combined with problem solving skills to enable students to realise the value of mathematics in a variety of contexts.

The subject is taught so connections are made with current events so students understand the relevance of the Maths they learn.

We aim to give every student a positive mathematical experience to achieve their potential. Our curriculum is delivered in such a way that "Maths is for all".

### **The Science Faculty**

We as a science department endeavour to cultivate a growth mind-set based on resilience where students feel safe to express their curiosity as they develop good grounding in the knowledge of the world around them.

Studying biology at BVGA allows students to build crucial analytical skills in the context of current real world situations, through learning about the body, the importance of health and the ever changing environment we need to protect.

Chemistry is a versatile subject that is an essential pre-requisite for many courses. Our curriculum begins with the structure of the atom and chemical reactions and leads on to crucial topics on futuristic materials, Earths finite and renewable resources to environmental chemistry and how our planet is affected by human activity. Chemistry guides students to not only grow in confidence, become critical thinkers, but also someone who identifies to be part of a global community whose actions contribute to building values and practices.

In Physics we aim to equip our students to navigate an increasingly technologically advanced world through the study of the universe on a variety of scales: from the tiny particles that make up everything around us, to the challenges faced by our increasing energy demands, through to the forces that hold the universe together

### **The Humanities Faculty**

Our vision is to empower students by opening their minds to other places, other faiths, other histories, other perspectives and other cultures; we seek to celebrate difference, rather than merely tolerating it. ### **History**

It is our intention to share our love of learning about the past and to inspire students with a passion for History which will endure throughout their lifetimes. We are committed to using the study of the past as a force for empowering students and preparing them for their roles as active global citizens in the twenty first century. *BVGA Curriculum Intent 2019-20*  Our aim is to promote the development of powerful knowledge which counters racism and stereotyping whilst also promoting community cohesion. Through the delivery of topics such as the Holocaust we seek to open students' eyes to the impact of prejudice and discrimination; we refuse to sanitise the past and we embrace controversial and challenging issues. We actively make links and connections between historical and modern societies to enable students to have a greater understanding of their place in the world. We see the study of History as a vehicle for securing a better future for our students and as a force for social mobility. By equipping students with the skills of analysis and evaluation, we prepare students for a wide range of careers with the potential to significantly improve their life chances.

### **Psychology**

In Psychology we equip our students with the knowledge and skills to find out more about our human brain and behaviour. We will facilitate a critical understanding of the symptoms, causes and treatments of a range of mental health conditions. This will promote the development of emotional intelligence through the consideration of challenging and controversial issues. We aim to develop an open-mindedness when looking into research, theories and evidence. Students will be encouraged to think critically when looking at the main approaches in psychology. This includes cognitive, biological social, behaviourist and psychodynamic approaches. We seek to provide a challenging yet supportive learning environment in order to facilitate a deeper understanding of human behaviour through analysis and evaluation. Furthermore, we aim to combat prejudice, challenge stereotypes and foster community cohesion. It is also our intention to promote the ability to make links with the other subjects studied in the faculty, whilst also developing confidence in understanding how science works and developing competence and knowledge of practical and mathematical skills.

We want to create students with academic self-efficacy who can think for themselves and take control of their own achievement.

### **Religious Studies**

In Religious Studies at BVGA we seek to enhance and broaden the young minds of our students, often through posing some big and controversial questions. Our aim is always to promote the appreciation of the diversity of beliefs and practices that exist not only in Britain but throughout the wider world.
