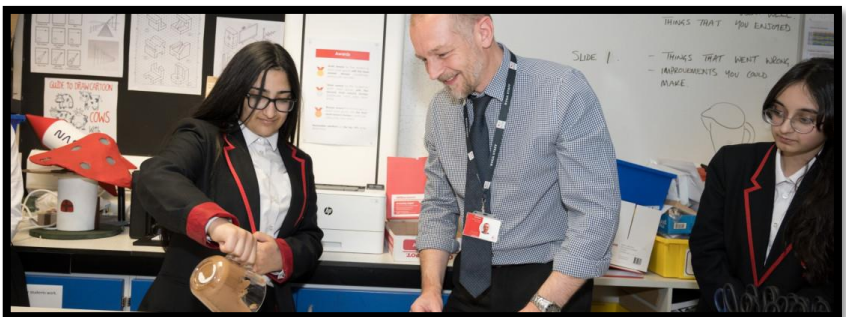
Our most recent Ofsted inspection was in December 2021 at which point we were judged to be **GOOD**.

What is it like to attend this school?

Pupils at Belle Vue Girls' Academy are proud of their school. They like the diversity, the fact that they meet people from a range of cultural backgrounds. Pupils say that behaviour in lessons is good. They enjoy being able to focus on their work without disruption. There is a calm, positive learning atmosphere in classrooms. Pupils are respectful and kind towards one another. The corridors are busy, but pupils feel safe. They are pleased to see so many staff on corridors. Staff know the pupils well. Pupils respect the staff who work with them. The school takes incidents of bullying seriously. Pupils say that bullying is rare. Most pupils and parents believe that staff deal with bullying effectively. Staff have high expectations of what pupils can achieve. They have established a curriculum that enables pupils to succeed academically. Leaders continue to take steps to develop pupils' love of reading. The school has a strong focus on the development of pupils' character and personal qualities. The chances the school offers for pupils to take on a leadership role are just one example of this.

Keeping young people safe is a key element of all the work we do. We have clear policies and procedures in place and a wealth of expertise amongst our staff, who take part in regular training as part of their continued professional development.

Tutor Time

We have clear systems and processes in place to ensure the highest standards are consistently met by our students.

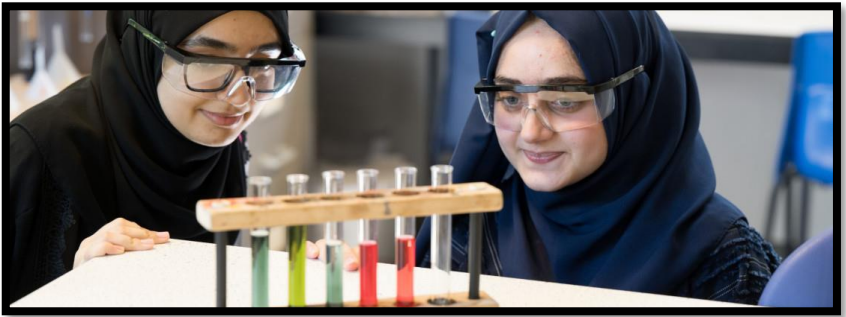
BVGA pupils are expected to:

- Be polite and show respect to fellow pupils.
- Wear the correct uniform at all times
- Know and then follow, without question, the procedures laid down in the event of a fire or other emergency.

Modern Foreign Languages

At Belle Vue Girls' Academy we offer 4 languages: Arabic, French, Spanish & Urdu

In year 7 pupils will be able to choose one of three of these languages. ** The languages that are available for each pupil will depend on which band pupils are in.**

During the first week of Language lessons teachers talk to pupils about the three languages they can choose.

In lesson 1 we ask pupils to write their three options in their planners to discuss with their parents.

In lesson 2 pupils choose which language they would like to study. Pupils put a number 1 for their first choice and a number 3 for their last choice. If Arabic or Urdu are available and is a pupil's first choice, they will complete a short assessment in this language in lesson 3.

In week 2 pupils are assigned a language. We work very hard to give all pupils their first choice, but we cannot always guarantee this. Pupils will never be given their 3rd choice.

Once pupils have been assigned to a language, they cannot swap languages and will study this language to GCSE.

If pupils already speak one of these languages fluently, they will not be able to study this language in school, but they can be entered to do a GCSE in this language when they are in year 10.

Our students learn about places that are outside of their own experience, develop their understanding of the world's diversity of peoples and cultures, and are encouraged to challenge stereotypes and foster understanding.



Trips, Clubs and Enrichment

Belle Vue Girls' Academy is committed to offering an excellent programme of enrichment activities and opportunities that every student can access.

This complements our broad and balanced curriculum, ensuring that every Belle Vue girl regularly steps outside her comfort zone, experiences something new, and gains the confidence to embrace new opportunities in the future.

- There is a strong culture of student voice at Belle Vue Girls, and students are encouraged to get involved in many of the different **Student Leadership** opportunities which the academy had to offer.
- A broad range of exciting **after-school clubs and activities**, from STEM club, to Calligraphy Club, to Culture Club, to Sports Hub, there is something at Belle Vue for everyone.
- Participation in the **Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme** from Year 9 onwards.
- Participation in the **National Citizen Service** from Year 11 onwards. We became an NCS Gold School in 2019.
- The opportunity to plan, lead, and participate in, national, regional and local **charity events**;
- The opportunity to get involved in student leadership, charity fundraising and local community work.

As a result, our students are thoughtful, considerate young people, who are proud to be global citizens, and to make a positive contribution to their school, their community, their country, and beyond. Students go on to study a broad range of subjects at universities both within and beyond West Yorkshire; they pursue purposeful and fulfilling careers in new areas, they travel widely and support their communities, always pushing at boundaries and stepping out of their comfort zones with growing confidence.



Uniform

All uniform clothing items are stocked by Rawcliffe's or Natasha's in Bradford.

- BVGA blazer
- Plain white shirt/blouse
- Plain 'academy style' black tunic or skirt (may be worn with black trousers)
- Optional red/black academy sleeveless jumper with logo, or a plain black jumper (no hoods/zips/logos)
- A plain black scarf can be worn
- Boots (low-heeled), trainers and shoes may be worn and must be plain black
- One pair of plain ear studs is permitted
- One small flat nose stud is the only permitted facial piercing
- Black jeans are not allowed
- No rings, bracelets, or necklaces
- No painted or false nails
- Very subtle, natural make-up is acceptable for older students

Transport

We have designated school bus services exclusively for Belle Vue Girls' Academy students that serve areas across Bradford, including BD3, BD5, BD7, BD8, BD9 and BD14. Please see below for information on routes and fares.

All students travelling on the school bus services will require an **Under 19's MCard**. The best MCard pass for use on the school services is a 'MyWeek' pass, which gets you unlimited travel across West Yorkshire for £9 per week. This is available via the MCard Mobile App.

All students travelling on the school bus services will also require a **Metro Priority PhotoCard**, which allows them to board the designated school bus. This card is free and has no cash value. Applications can be made online.

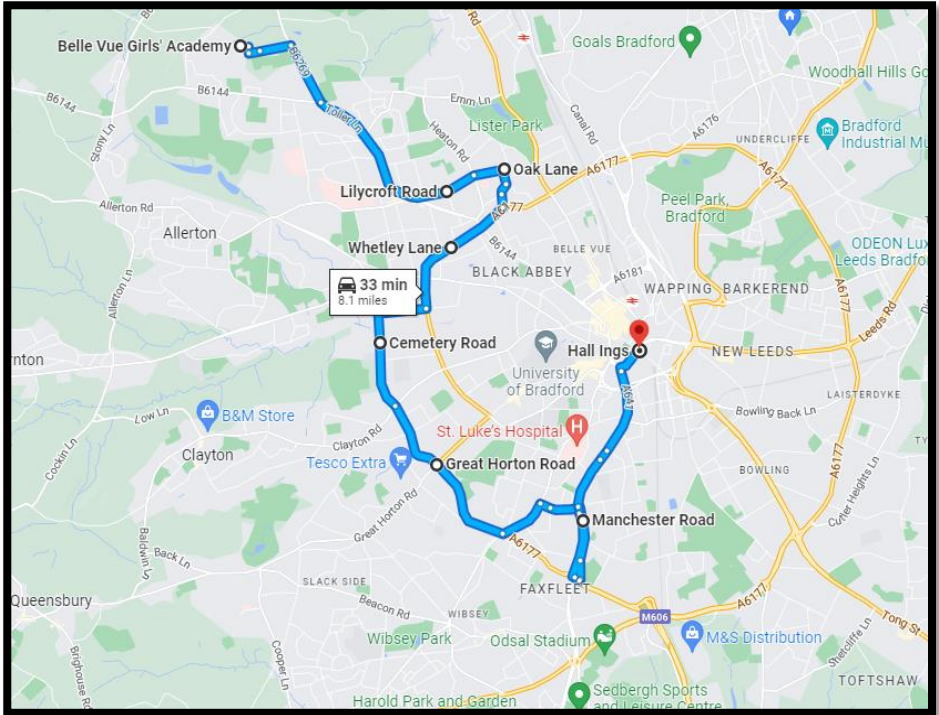

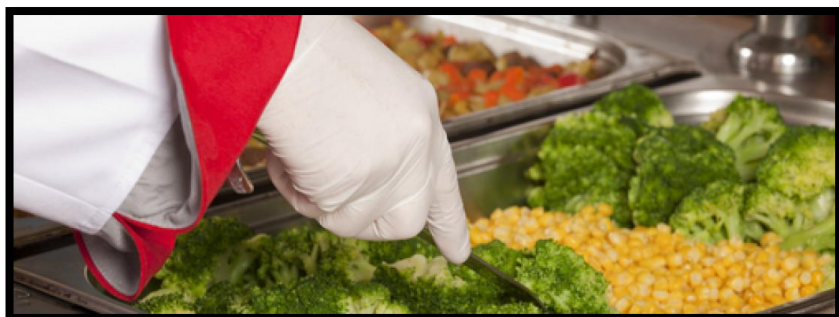
