

PASTORAL CARE

The Pastoral Team at Belle Vue Girls' Academy support students in all aspects of pastoral care. Each year group has a dedicated non-teaching Pastoral Manager who champions students through their educational journey as well as being the key point of contact for parents. The Pastoral Team offers wellbeing and mental health support including access to the school nurse and school counselling service as well as offering guidance and advice to ensure academic success.

Each year group has a Head of Year who monitors academic progress and provides the support needed to ensure all students achieve. The team works collaboratively with students, teachers and families to ensure that all have good attendance, that all feel safe and valued and where all can learn, achieve and be successful.

FAMILY PARTNERSHIPS

The key driver to a child's success is the partnership between school and family. At Belle Vue Girls' Academy we endorse strong family partnerships. This is achieved through clear and regular communication with parents including the school's newsletter, the Class Charts App, visits and telephone conversations. Parents have the opportunity to be part of the school community through regular visits to the school for parents' evenings, information evenings, and community and parenting events. Through school and parents working together we can achieve an exceptional educational experience for all.

SAFEGUARDING

Keeping young people safe is a key element of all the work we do. We have clear policies and procedures in place and a wealth of expertise amongst our staff, who take part in regular training as part of their continued professional development.

Our Safeguarding Principles:


- > The welfare of the child is paramount

TEACHING AND LEARNING

Our ambitious curriculum is delivered by highly knowledgeable and skilled subject specialist teachers. All teachers follow clear and well-established routines, which allow all students to focus completely on their learning. We have very high expectations; we want all our students to be actively engaged independent learners, with high aspirations for themselves. Assessment is built into the curriculum; students receive frequent feedback to inform them of their progress and identify next steps, and students are set regular CAP tasks (consolidation, application, preparation) to complete at home.

THE CURRICULUM

The aim of our curriculum is to provide an exceptional educational experience for all, enabling all our learners to become academically, socially, culturally and emotionally fulfilled young people, ready to take their place in the world. The curriculum is ambitious, challenging, cohesive, inclusive and enjoyable. It builds character and empowers students so that they become **confident learners, confident communicators, and confident future citizens**.

KEY STAGE 3 CURRICULUM

In Year 7, 8 and 9 students have 25 one-hour lessons each week, plus half an hour of tutor time every day, through which we deliver the Personal Development Curriculum.

All students follow a broad and balanced curriculum which is carefully planned and sequenced to ensure all students build powerful subject knowledge, learn subject specific skills and develop a deep love of learning.

All students study English, Maths, Science, Languages (French, Spanish, Urdu, Arabic or Italian), History, Geography, Philosophy, Religion and Ethics, Art, Music, Drama, Design Technology (Product Design, Graphics, Food and Textiles), ICT, and PE.

Alternative curriculum pathways are part of our SEND provision. Our Nurture Group and Thrive Group each receive small group teaching by specialist teachers in a dedicated area. All pupils on the SEND and Below Age Related Expectations registers have a My Support Plan or IEP and a link Teaching Assistant to help support them to access the mainstream curriculum.

THE KEY STAGE 4 CURRICULUM

In Year 10 and 11 students have 25 one-hour lessons each week, plus half an hour of tutor time every day, through which we deliver the Personal Development Curriculum.

Students follow a personalised pathway which is appropriately challenging and carefully designed to prepare them effectively for future learning and employment. Almost all students study 9 GCSEs or equivalent, with the majority following the EBacc pathway.

All students in Year 10 and 11 study English Language, English Literature, Maths, Science and Core PE (non-GCSE). Students study four option subjects from a choice of: History, Geography, Languages (French, Spanish, Urdu, Arabic or Italian), Philosophy, Religion and Ethics, Art, Drama, Music, Film, ICT, Graphics, Product Design, Food and Nutrition, Business Studies, Health and Social Care, and Sport.



Alternative curriculum pathways are part of the SEND offer at BVGA, this includes an ASDAN qualification provision for pupils in KS4. The ASDAN Group receives small group teaching by specialist teachers in a dedicated area. We offer entry level English and Maths qualifications for learners for whom the GCSE pathway is not appropriate.'

THE KEY STAGE 5 CURRICULUM

In the Sixth Form, students study three A Level or Level 3 Applied Vocational qualifications. They also study for a Leadership qualification, and complete the Progression Module (Y12), and the Information, Advice and Guidance Programme (Y13) to ensure students are prepared for university and their future career.

Students also have one hour of personal development every week, and a great many opportunities to pursue enrichment and leadership opportunities.

The Sixth Form prospectus provides more detail about the curriculum pathways, subjects and entry requirements. Our curriculum offer includes A Level Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Maths, English Literature, History, Geography, Psychology, Sociology, Philosophy, Religion and Ethics, French, Spanish, Urdu, Art and Design and Level 3 Vocational Applied courses in Applied Science, Applied Law, Business, Criminology, Health and Social Care and Information Technology.

ENRICHING AND LIFE CHANGING OPPORTUNITIES

THE PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT CURRICULUM

Personal Development at BVGA prepares students for the wider world by supporting their wellbeing, empowering them with skills and knowledge and giving them powerful voices. Students follow a Personal Development Curriculum which is delivered by the form tutor in two tutor time sessions per week. It is organised around six key themes, with knowledge and understanding developed incrementally. The six themes are: Wellbeing and Health, Relationships and Communities, Character and Aspiration, Human Rights and the Environment, Power and Politics, Careers and Finance.

Personal Development encompasses the following key strands, many of which have links to the subject curriculum: Fundamental British Values Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural education Relationships, Health and Sex education, Student leadership and Student voice, the assembly programme, Votes For Schools and Character education.

Form Captains are elected, whilst other student leaders are appointed following an application process and, in the case of Year Captains and the Academy Captain, an interview. We work with partner organisations to ensure that the voice of Belle Vue students is heard on both a local and national level.

ENRICHMENT

We offer diverse enrichment activities accessible to all students, complementing our broad curriculum. These activities, such as the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme, National Citizen Service, and charity leadership, help students step outside their comfort zones, gain confidence, and embrace new opportunities. Our students become thoughtful global citizens, contributing positively to their communities and pursuing fulfilling careers and studies with growing confidence.

CAREERS

Our comprehensive careers education programme offers personalised guidance, industry insights, and practical experiences. This includes work placements for all Year 10 and 12 students, and the Progression Module, which prepares Year 12 students for Higher Education and employment. Additionally, our annual careers fair brings students together with education establishments and employers, helping them make informed choices to succeed both academically and professionally.

DESTINATIONS

With our strong academic foundation and comprehensive support systems, students transition smoothly to a wide range of opportunities. Many pursue higher education at prestigious universities locally and nationally, while others embark on exciting apprenticeships, vocational training, or direct entry into the workforce.

ALUMNI

Our Alumni provide invaluable support for students as they navigate their educational journey and career planning. The network utilises the lived experiences of ex-students allowing students an insight into a variety of industries ranging from medicine and law to engineering and publishing. Hearing Alumni journeys and successes provides inspirational, relatable role models who share their own experiences through mentoring, cultivating a sense of confidence and clarity in students.
